A Workshop based on Translation Studies was conducted Online in October and November 2020. Retired Faculty, Department of English, of the College, **Prof. Dr. Vandana** Pathak and Dr. Sawan Dharampuriwar, Assistant Professor, Department of English, Vidyasagar Arts Mahavidyalaya, Khairi (Bijewada), Ramtek, Nagpur were the invited Resource Persons who interacted with the students on the various aspects of Translation. Both the Resource Persons have been actively involved in translation and published their works based on translation. The students of B. A. Semester III, Supplementary English submitted translations. The students chose their own topics for the translations based on their mother tongue into English, the target language. These translations were compiled as a project.



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Twenty three students submitted their Translations in November 2020 on recipes, short stories, etc. from Marathi, Hindi, Sindhi, Bengali and Marwadi as their source language translating it in to English language.

Intention of this workshop, Guest Lectures and submission of Translations was to provide exposure, inculcate interest and skill amongst the students.

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
Report Roundtable on Rabindranath Tagore's One Act Play, 'Chitra' 30th April 2021, Friday

A Virtual Roundtable for B. A. Semester VI, Compulsory English students was held on Rabindranath Tagore's One Act Play, 'Chitra' from 12:50 to 14: 50 on Google Meet on 30th April 2021. This event was held under the aegis of Mindtools, a Department of English venture to develop skills amongst students. At the beginning, Nidhee Meshram acquainted the participants about the Aims, Objectives and Outcomes of the Roundtable. This Roundtable was primarily organised keeping in view providing a platform for the vernacular students to let them explore their skills. Their comprehension of the text was the focus and hence, this event was multilingual, using Marathi, Hindi and English as the language of expression. In the Outcomes it was suggested that the vernacular students would certainly understand the importance of English as a professional language, and self - motivation would be playing a crucial role in trying to attain proficiency over the English language.

Since the Semester VI students of Humanities do not formally study Skills of oratory or discussions, this Roundtable was intended to provide them with an opportunity to express themselves as a joint event for all the three medium students. As they would be graduates soon, the Department of English ventured into this endeavor to help them acquire professional skills and life skills. Total eight speakers presented their thoughts on the various aspects of the One Act Play, 'Chitra'.



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


Shruti Wagh, (MM) presented her views on Chitra through an intertextual reference of cinema. She also made comparisons regarding prejudices that women continue to face even in the contemporary times. How breaking the stereotypes have been instrumental in shaping the society to believe that skills are natural and independent to an individual against any gender biases.




Chandrakala Yadav, (HM) spoke at length regarding the play focusing particularly on the main character. How Chitra's parents were able to cross the barriers by grooming her to become a warrior and surpass the inhibitions regarding gender biases and shoulder the responsibility of a King..

Bhuminka Devikar, (MM), tried to enter into the mind of Chitra, sensing multidimensional and conflicting thoughts that finally are able to resolve her into the process to accept reality from the otherwise make belief world that she requested the Gods to create to seek Arjuna's attention and love.



Deepali Sunam, (HM), tried to relate the personality of Chitra to a common contemporary girl. She voiced that the inner beauty of a human being is more crucial than physical beauty. The one act play suggests this concept in an effective way, where personality matters more than external beauty that incidentally lies in the eyes of the beholder.





Aditi Raut, (EM) expressed that the play is universal to women. She felt that Tagore has skillfully challenged the standards of beauty and general norms. He chose a strong woman protagonist who deferred the stereotypical notion of femininity. Later, Chitra alters herself into the typical framework of a female to seek Arjuna's love that she long has been imagining in her dreams. She in the process tries to explore her personality.



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Arya Dixit, (EM), discussed different themes presented in the play. She said though the play is adapted from mythology, it holds relevance in contemporary times. She felt that there is a deliberate suppression of Chitra's feminine side in order to live up to her father's expectations, reflecting role ambiguity. Vasanta, the God granting Chitra beauty only for a year could be a pretention of falsehood as ambiguity does not last long. Later on Chitra reaches a stage when she does not mind rejection and attains her peace of mind by accepting reality.

Arushi Chakraborthy, (EM) spoke about Chitra's inferiority complex and how relevant it is in 21st century as well. After meeting Arjuna she decks up in best garment, and makes the first move which was unprecedented then and still unusual today. But Arjun's rejection at that instance brings in the feeling of inferiority complex, compelling her to seek help from the Gods. This aspect deals will today's unrealistic beauty standards that seek help of apps that filter us to look good and attractive and denies us our own identity for acceptance.




Aadhya Tiwari, (EM) raised certain questions as to why in the first place Chitra was not treated like a female as she could have still be able to display her warrior skills with proper training as they were perhaps inbuilt. She further voiced the double standards of society when Arjuna rejects her when she appears as real Chitra. But later accepts her as she turns beautiful and instantaneously dissolves his vow of celibacy. This only proves that both, Chitra and Arjuna run away from their truthfulness.

Highlight of the event was when all the eight speakers, attendees and teachers, **Dr. Shilpa Sarode, Neha Thosar** and **Nidhee Meshram** discussed at length about the play. The deliberations proved to be fruitful as a learning tool regarding the different point- of- views, perceptions and nuances of the text, including the way Rabindranath Tagore skillfully adapted the play focusing on woman character from North- East and how aesthetically the figurative language of the play along with its under tones made it even more expressive.



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This discussion at the end further reiterated the success of the Roundtable as it set forth the tempo of organising such academic oriented events in future regularly.

A feedback form was also provided to the attendees. This was the first of its kind Virtual Roundtable that the Department of English instigated for the students and by the students of the College.

Book Review Report Black Warrant

"The Book Club", a new initiative of the Department of English was initiated this year on 22 October 2020 and was inaugurated at the hands of Vice Principal, Mrs Radhika Yelkawar. The online inaugural event was a book review of the book "Black Warrant" by Sunetra Chaudhary . Arushi Chakrabarty, a student of BA Sem V, English Medium , reviewed the book for its content, style and language .

She said that the book was an account of Tihar Jail, New Delhi, as seen through the eyes of Sunil Gupta, former assistant Superintendent at Tihar, and woven into words by Sunetra Choudhury, journalist and anchor with The Hindustan Times, author of the 2017 book "Behind Bars". An account of some of India's most famous prisoners, Black Warrant is a candid and macabre account of the life at Tihar, the odd hierarchy where prisoners with power tower over other prisoners and even the authorities themselves. It also recounts some of the most notorious inmates of the prison, from Charles Sobhraj to Nirbhaya's rapists, each denoting an era where India's law failed civilians and politicians alike.

The book review was met with a hearty response, and various questions were presented at the end of the program. Two of the most interesting questions are given below.

Q 1. Is co-authoring a book prone to being biased?

A. Co-authoring is a great way to bring in two different points of view into a story, to give it more depth than a single author could usually do. The story of one, and the words of another is a team project. About the problem of getting biased, that is left to the sensitivities of the authors to lean towards a belief or ideology, especially if the book is about a political or historical issue. The best case is when both authors take an objective approach to the substance of the story, and present it as it is.

Q 2. Can we say that the Black Warrant is a call for the government to initiate reforms? A. Absolutely! This book's main aim is not to instill fear or shock by recounting India's most notorious criminals, but to give the readers a glimpse of a system that has failed us time and again with all its loopholes and corruption, by allowing criminals with power to leave captivity at the cost of a few crisp notes, and the weak to perish without ever receiving the



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justice they were denied. So yes, this book is indeed a call for the government as well as the law enforcers to initiate many great reforms to ensure safety, dignity and prevention of misuse of power by anyone.

The Chief Guest for the function was Mr Sachin Jahagirdar, Treasurer & Trustee of Nagpur First Foundation, a book lover and avid reviewer of books on history. He appreciated the initiative of the Book Club and wished it all success. Vice principal, Mrs Radhika Yelkawar inaugurated The Book Club. The teachers of the department all worked for the programme. The Department thanks the Principal Dr Kotwal for all her support in this departmental venture.






In the second session the Former Vice Principal of L.A.D College Dr. Kalpana Dhawad guided the participant for Pranayam and Dhyan .

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
Azaadi ka Amrut Mohotsay



More than 100 students attended the programme.




Ten students made their Paper Presentations in this series and Chairpersons were invited for each session to familiarize students of professionalism in their last Semester of under- graduation.


Third Day of the Paper Presentations on 19th of May 2021 had –


through a highly interactive question and answer round to reassure them with their first attempt of presenting research papers.
